HAQAA Initiative: Objectives

“Contribute to and support the harmonisation of higher education programmes and the creation of a revitalised, distinctive, attractive and globally competitive African higher education space, through enhanced intra-African collaboration”

- Development of a harmonised quality assurance and accreditation system at institutional level, national, regional and Pan-African continental level

= Boost the *‘The Pan-African Quality Assurance and Accreditation System’ (PAQAF)*



General Approach of HAQAA

- Enhancing continental collaboration in quality assurance across and between regional networks
- Linking together/building upon regional initiatives and political priorities
- Capacity Building for both internal and external QA at the institutional, national and regional level
- Promoting good practices/ sharing experiences in a multilateral way: *Europe-Africa, Africa-Africa, Africa - other world regions*



Methodology

- Rooted in not only African stakeholder buy-in but also African ***organisational capacity*** to sustain the endeavour
 - ‘Africa Centre for Capacity Development in QA’ (housed by **AAU**)
 - Advisory Board with key regional bodies, networks, associations
- Maximize impact = **synergies** with other current African QA-related initiatives, especially those that are EU and AUC supported
 - Tuning, Intra-Africa Mobility, World Bank, UNESCO/Recognition conventions....
- Engaging countries, organisations and institutions that have participated less frequently in African continental activities



Phases and activities (1)

- ***Phase 1: Developing a common understanding on QA in Africa (January 2016 – June 2017)***
 - Set up of the Online African QA Platform:
www.aau.org/haqaa
 - Consolidation of an expert database on QA in Africa
 - Mapping report on current/existing African QA ‘Standards and Guidelines’ (national and regional)
 - Training Course for a “common QA language”, targeting key African QA disseminators
(all countries)

Training Course on a Common Language for QA in Africa

- The Training Course brings together experts representing QA agencies and ministries from across all five African regions.
- 2 cohorts: Anglophone and Francophone that had a first, one-week '*presence*' phase in Belgium and Germany respectively in October and November 2016.



Training Course on a Common Language for QA in Africa

The Training Course will continue to its second and third phases in 2017 with:

Online Phase: ongoing → April

- DAAD to animate a practice sharing platform with discussion groups.
- Participants to elaborate personal action plans.

2nd Presential Phase: 30 May-02 June

- For both cohorts as a pre-event of the AAU General Conference
- Topic: QA 'landscape' in Africa and the roles of different actors and stakeholders in taking forward the African continental agenda



Phases and activities (2)

- ***Phase 2: Towards a Pan African QA and Accreditation System: Developing African Standards and Guidelines for quality assurance (ASG-QA) and reinforcing institutional “internal” QA (June 2016 – Sept 2017)***
 - Technical Working Group to develop the ASG-QA
 - Needs Assessment and Online consultation for the ASG-QA
 - Continental endorsement workshop (second half 2017)

Technical Working Group (TWG) for the development of ASG-QA

- 1st Meeting in Namibia – September 2016
- Presentation and discussion of the Template/Draft Structure to the Advisory Board Meeting. Structure will indicate the rationale for developing the ASG-QA, their intended purpose and the elements to be included.
- February, 2017: Online consultation process on draft structure

Technical Working Group for the development of the ASG-QA

1st Draft

- 4 languages
- End of April-Beg of May
- To be presented at the AAU Conference (5-9 June 2017)

2nd Draft

- Development and, Consultation Workshop late August (venue TBD)

Final Draft

- To be presented at the EU-Africa Summit in November (exact date and venue TBD)

Phases and activities (3)

- ***Phase 3: Consolidating ‘quality culture’ in Africa (February 2017 – April 2018)***
 - Visits to select African QA agencies/bodies, promoting the uptake and testing of the ASG-QA – ‘Consultancy visits’ and ‘agency reviews’
 - QA agency staff development workshop
 - Institutional capacity building through 15 institutional evaluations (AQRM) – *call forthcoming*

Institutional evaluations employing the AQRM

- One of the HAQAA objectives is to support institutional quality culture and self-assessment.
- AQRM: self-assessment tool
- Experts will visit selected universities (15) to verify provided data

Institutional evaluations employing the AQRM

3.	Completion of AQRM Questionnaire online by 15 selected universities	03-21 April 2017
4.	Institutional Site Visits to the 15 universities for information verification	19-30 June 2017

Phases and activities (4)

- ***Phase 4: Sustainability and further development of the Pan African QA and Accreditation System (February 2018 – September 2018)***
 - Endorsement of external review model for QA agencies in Africa (proposed by Technical Working Group)
 - Regional conference, reinforcing ‘ICQAHEA/AQAF’ as an annual continental forum
 - Consolidation of African QA Platform/Database and Capacity Development Centre as major continental tools and structures
